September 2nd 1945 marks the end of the Second World War on this day aboard the USS Missouri marks the last time the United States and its allies achieved an unambiguous victory in war. Korea, Viet Nam, Iraq and Afghanistan represent four costly wars fought since this day in 1945. None of them represent a clear victory. All of them represent seriously flawed war strategies. No Way to Fight a War explores our drift from a full commitment to victory in war how we lost our way and, most importantly, how we find our way back before its too late. It is a book in which groups as diverse as the Veterans of Foreign Wars and Code Pink can find common ground. No Way to Fight a War is a politically incorrect accounting that challenges the conventional wisdom of the elites in both political parties.
